Dinosaur egg recreated

"It is possible that dinosaurs will walk the earth again one day", says Welsh Scientist Prof Ian Jones.

Scientists at the BioTech laboratories in Cardiff, Wales said yesterday that they could now remake dinosaurs. After many years of work, the Welsh scientists have succeeded in reproducing the DNA (the recipe for life) of a Tyrannosaurus Rex.

In theory, this could be transplanted into a T-Rex cell. This could lead to a fertilized egg which could grow into the giant dinosaur.
