Dinosaur egg recreated

"It is possible that dinosaurs will walk the earth again one day", says Welsh Scientist Prof Ian Jones.

Scientists at the BioTech laboratories in Cardiff, Wales announced yesterday that they could now recreate dinosaurs. After many years of experimentation and laboratory work, the Welsh scientists have succeeded in reconstructing the DNA (the recipe for life) of a Tyrannosaurus Rex.

In theory, this could be transplanted into a T-Rex stem cell and lead to a fertilized egg which could grow into the giant dinosaur.
